# **SUPPLY CHAINS**

**Italsteel's supply chains pose the highest risk of modern slavery, so it is a must that we do our due diligence in assessing each of our suppliers.**

**Most of our steel comes from Australian suppliers, which is considered a low-risk location. However, these suppliers source steel from international mills in the United Arab Emirates, Korea, Thailand, and China.**

**It is crucial for us to regularly evaluate these corporations to ensure safety.**

**We maintain and regularly review the register of our suppliers, focusing particularly on those based in regions with a history of labour abuse.**

# RISK ASSESSMENT



**One of the primary human rights risks Italsteel faces is modern slavery within our supply chains.**

**This risk is increased due to global supply, sourcing various products and services from overseas providers.**

**Modern slavery can infiltrate supply chains through forced labour, child labour, debt bondage, human trafficking, inadequate wages, and discriminatory practices.**

**Italsteel works proactively to identify and mitigate modern slavery risks in our supply chains and operations.**

**When assessing suppliers of both labour and material, Indicators such as product and service types, geographical locations of suppliers, and specific entity risks, are accounted for in the assessment.**

**All business partnerships are regularly reviewed throughout the business relationship.**

# ASSESSING THE EFFECTIVENESS

To ensure the effectiveness of our actions in combating modern slavery, Italtel has implemented the following measures:

## Regular IMS Audits:

- Audits are conducted to ensure compliance with our anti-slavery policies and standards. These audits are followed by thorough

## Management Reviews:

- To assess findings, implement corrective actions, and continuously improve our practices.

## Supplier Assessments:

- Annual supplier assessments are reviewed to ensure they adhere to our ethical standards and practices.

## Feedback:

- Maintaining open lines of supplier feedback, allowing any concerns or incidents related to modern slavery to be reported



**As well as ensuring that all team members are well-informed about the risks and strategies regarding modern slavery, Italsteel has an anonymous reporting system. This creates an easy environment for notification of unethical conduct. Any suspected or reported activity will be investigated.**

# CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT
